Brilliance & the Beast Marc Destrubé takes the reins





"Marc Destrubé is one of the few musicians that The Smithsonian Institute entrusts to play its precious Stradivarius and Amati violin collection," says Paul Dyer, Artistic Director of the Australian Brandenburg Orchestra. "He is also one of the very few musicians to who I entrust the Brandenburg."

Paul has asked his friend and long-time musical collaborator to take the reins and direct the Brandenburg in their Sydney and Melbourne performances of **Mozart Tempest**. While Marc will be leading the Orchestra through Mozart's music on period instruments, Paul will be conducting Baroque Triple Bill for Victorian Opera.

Critics have used the words like 'elegance' and 'virtuosic brilliance' to describe Marc's playing and he was recently lauded by an enthusiastic 16 year-old on Facebook, who called him a 'friggin beast'. "Marc is a dynamic musician who brings style and adventure to every performance" says Paul Dyer.

"I'm very excited to return to the wonderful Brandenburg; they feel like a musical family to me," says Marc, "both through my long friendship with Paul Dyer and through the wonderful musical experiences we have shared in the past."

The Canadian violinist, who is returning to direct the Brandenburg for the fifth time, is an exceptionally versatile musician, who regularly performs chamber music, as soloist, concertmaster or director of orchestras on modern and period instruments.

In addition to leading the Axelrod Quartet of The Smithsonian Institute in Washington D.C., he is the co-concertmaster of the Amsterdam-based Orchestra of the 18th Century, a group he has played with for thirty years. He was also the founder of the Pacific Baroque Orchestra, has collaborated with a post-punk hip-hop band, and has created works combining French baroque with indigenous Canadian dance.

Mozart Tempest will provide a happy reunion for Marc and **Kristian Bezuidenhout**, the guest fortepianist: "We last performed together in very similar circumstances in Beijing. It was in the city's National Centre for the Performing Arts, and we were performing Mozart and I was leading the Orchestra of the 18th Century."
