Vivaldi is a man who has brought the world incredible amounts of joy, yet sadly the creator of one of the world's most famous and loved pieces of classical music died a pauper and his magnificent music lay largely forgotten for almost 200 years. But that certainly hasn't stopped his **Four Seasons** becoming the most recorded classical work in music history. But why is it so popular?

In an evening of splendour and vibrancy, **The Four Seasons** is preceded by Vivaldi's **Concerto for Two Horns** and Dall'Abaco's divine **Concerto No.5 for oboe**, which combines the brilliance of the Italian Vivaldi style with the grandeur and elegance of French court music.

The oboe soloist is the wonderful **Kirsten Barry** whose divine recordings of the Albinoni & Marcello Oboe Concertos on the Brandenburg's recently released **Sanctuary CD** made it an instant best-seller.

Also on the program is Vivaldi's Concerto for Cello in G minor, written for the outstanding all-female orchestra of the Ospedale della Pieta in Venice which was the must-see tourist attraction of the day.

The Brandenburg Principal Cello, **Jamie Hey** is soloist. This is a great opportunity to see why Jamie's solo performances create huge excitement amongst both audience members and his fellow musicians.
